- ▶ Optional cover letter
- ▶ Selection criteria – 4 questions (500 words per question, STAR approach recommended)
- ▶ Online 2 clinical referees
 - ▶ Consultant, registrar, RMO, nurses, allied health etc
- ▶ Then upload all the documents through MedJobsWA link
- ▶ Managed by PMCWA (equivalent to PMCV)

- ▶ No referees
- ▶ You apply to networks containing one major tertiary provider and usually some rural hospitals
- ▶ 4 recruitment pathways: Aboriginal Medical Workforce, **Rural Preferential Recruitment (involves interviews and preferencing)**, Direct Regional Allocation, **Optimised Allocation**

- ▶ EPAS training (online modules for electronic medical record system) required prior to application

GENERAL ADVICE

- ▶ Check step-by-step user manual on each website
- ▶ English language results (AHPRA)
 - ▶ <https://www.ahpra.gov.au/registration/registration-standards/english-language-skills.aspx>
- ▶ Effort & time spent doing the applications
 - ▶ Victoria = the most time consuming application
 - ▶ ACT and WA = next time consuming application with extensive “selection criteria” responses
 - ▶ SA = requires EPAS online module training
 - ▶ QLD = requires some written response; why QLD, which hospitals
 - ▶ NSW = ballot based. Least time consuming.
- ▶ Start early and apply broadly. It’s all about time management!
