

National Audit

Intern applicant information are shared between states and territories on preagreed dates.

- 18 November 2022 - national close dates for offers of internship.

Applicants who have applied for and/or accepted more than one intern position will be contacted and given 48 hours to withdraw all except the one they intend to undertake next year.

Late Vacancy Management Process

- Starts on 5th December 2022 and ends on 24 March 2023.
- The process ensures any late vacancies are offered to eligible intern applicants who have not yet accepted an internship position
- No separate application required.





- Aim: Being a safe and competent doctor
- Ambition: General Surgeon



Internship Application Process

- Relatively straightforward with minimal struggle
- Process:
 - o Access PMCV website
 - O Satisfy requirements e.g.
 - Nominate referees
 - CV
 - Preference 8 health services
 - *Upload supporting documents if P3 or VRGP?

Choosing your health service

- 2nd most stressful part about internship application
- Factors to consider:
 - Location
 - Some doctors prefer working in a hospital with their partners
 - Family
 - Current accommodation
 - Change of scenery (e.g. rural -> metro, metro -> rural, metro -> metro, rural -> rural)
 - Familiarity
 - Where you spent your clinical years at
 - Hospital system e.g. EMR, navigation, line of communication (e.g. Western Health boasts horizontal or flat hierarchy)
 - Career pathways
 - Surgery/Physician/Psych/Trauma/ED etc
 - Work culture
 - Positive/Supportive workplace
 - One that fosters a safe environment eg. ability to speak up, report ill-mannered behaviours etc
 - Patient catchment areas
 - Diversity
 - Complexity of conditions (e.g. tertiary hospital vs rural hospital)



More about preferencing

- Preference 8 health services
- Top 3 health services will view it as your "1st choice/Top 3"
 - O E.g. Top 3: Melbourne Health, Goulburn Valley, Bendigo.
 - O Question: So does it matter how I preference my top 3 choices since the health service wouldn't know
 - O Answer: Yes it still matters. The selection process may be confusing for some
- 4th -8th choice will be viewed as the respective order (e.g. 4th choice = Western Health, then Western Health will know you've preferenced them as your 4th choice)

Referees

- Nominate 2 referees (Clinical referees)
- Senior registrar -> Consultant
- Certain health services may require clinical & non-clinical referee
- Tips on securing a good referee
 - Be punctual
 - O Show that you're responsible, safe, eager to learn and most importantly, genuine
 - Letting the consultant know early that you want them to be your referee
- Look for RED FLAGS!
 - O Consultants you do not vibe with
 - Consultants who may be overly critical (not always a bad thing)
 - O Consultants notorious for giving bad feedback/scores



Cover Letter

- The most stressful component
- What is it?
 - O A personalised drafted one page letter directed to the respective health se
- Information it should contain
 - o Purpose
 - Brief introduction
 - Why have you chosen this health service
- Tips on writing
 - o Grammar
 - Sentence structure
 - Avoid bombastic or flowery words
 - Avoid cluttering the page
- Start writing them early next year (~March 2024)
- ?Hire professional CV and Cover Letter writers/vetters
- Writer's block?
 - Take a break, return to this task another day:)



Curriculum Vitae

- Template on PMCV website
- Relevancy: High school -> Current
- Things to include:
 - Education/Qualifications
 - Clinical placements
 - Employment history
 - Volunteering history
 - Achievements and Awards
 - o Research, Publications, Presentations
 - O Leadership roles and Extracurricular Activities
 - o Personal interests

Advice

- Enjoy MD 4
- Support each other!
 - Inform each other of deadlines
 - Read each other's CV/Cover Letter if you'd like to
- You'll feel a huge load off your chest upon submitting your internship application form!
- Best of luck for your exams!



- Realised I had more confidence in my ability to make the most of a situation than in PMCV + wanted to be able to plan in advance
 - o 26 Aug (5 days later): 2 offers came out the complicated logistics of that

Advice

- 2) Being unmatched is not a reflection of how great of a doctor you are going to be
- It never seems as if it will happen to you so hope for the best and plan for the worst
- 4) Don't feel pressured to take the first option



VRPA – KEY INFORMATION

- Victorian Rural Preferential Allocation match process and allocations take place before main round match for both PIs and P2s
- Only rural health services regional/rural hospitals and VRGP programs
- 100% of all VRGP positions
 - As of 2022, VRGP positions only initially available during VRPA round
- Other rural health services vary year-by-year*

VRPA Intern positions

All of the Rural Generalist (RG) internship positions (100%) will be included in the VRPA round. For all other rural and regional health services, between 50-100% of their available positions will be included.

VRPA – HOW TO PREPARE YOURSELF

Things to consider:

- Think about whether practicing medicine rurally is right for you
- Working in rural hospital (benefits vs challenges) clinical exposure, work environment and support
- Rural lifestyle, connections to rural Victoria e.g. family, friends
- Career goals
- Practical reasons likely to match earlier than main round
- Start researching early about health services







VRPA – HOW TO PREPARE YOURSELF



CV and past experience

Clinical exposure in rural setting (e.g. electives, MD3 GP placements) can play in your favor

Show interest in the health services

- hospital tours, info sessions, career fairs (!! Make yourself known to the health services)



Cover Letter

Motivation – why do you want to work in rural hospital(s)?

What do you aim to achieve out of completing a rural internship?

Challenges anticipated in rural setting

What you can offer as an intern – skills, experiences

Knowledge of the health services – values, specific rotations/education programs



Interviews

3 Standard questions
+ one additional rural-specific question



- Victorian Rural Generalist Program (VRGP)
- A specific training program under the VRPA process for Rural Generalist (RG) training towards FACRRM/FRACGP
- Internship = Rural Generalist Trainee I (RGI)
- Only available under VRPA round if positions leftover, will be offered up later before P2 match
- Key difference from typical internship: 2 terms (~20 weeks) of GP rotation in rural GPs and regional medical centres + 3 Core terms (Gen med, ED, surgery) at regional hospitals
- What happens after internship/RGI?
 - Guaranteed training position as RG2 \square Rural Generalist Training Program (RG2 \square RG Advanced \square Fellowship)
 - PMCV match for PGY2/HMO2 ☐ Move back to regional/metro hospitals

Junior Doctor Training Program (JDTP)

Overview

The Junior Doctor Training Program — Private Hospital Stream (JDTP), previously known as the Commonwealth Medical Internship (CMI), is a federally funded initiative for **full-fee** paying international students who have completed their entire medical education in Australian universities. It supports PGY1-3 placements for medical graduates in private hospitals across Australia, with all doctors completing at least one rural rotation.

Through an Expression of Interest process, junior doctors are able to express interest for Private Hospital Stream PGY1 funded internship placements. The EOI process is available after states and territories have offered and filled their internship placements.

List of Participating Hospitals

The following private hospitals are funded from 2020-2022 for up to 115 internship positions:

- · Mater Health Services, North Queensland
- Mercy Health and Aged Care Central, Queensland
- MQ Health, New South Wales (Macquarie University Hospital)
- St John of God Ballarat Hospital, Victoria
- Mater Hospital, Sydney
- Ramsey Health Care, Western Australia
- Greenslopes Private Hospital, Queensland
- Calvary Health Care Riverina, New South Wales
- St Vincent's Private Hospital, Sydney

The PHS will also support around 80 places for PGY 2 and 3 junior doctors.

Eligibility

Under the PHS, participating private hospitals must prioritise eligible international full fee paying medical graduates from onshore Australian medical schools (referred to as 'Priority One' category). Should the PHS places not be filled with applicants from the Priority One category, private hospitals may recruit eligible applicants with provisional registration (referred to as 'Priority Two' category).

Priority One category will be allocated to onshore Australian-trained final year medical students who are eligible for an internship under the PHS. Final year medical students must meet all of the following eligibility criteria to be considered:

 Be a full- fee paying international student completing your medical degree in the current calendar year from a medical school in Australia, having completed all your

medical degree in Australia (university-approved, short-term elective rotation completed overseas are allowed)

- Have me the Medical Board of Australia (MBA) English language proficiency requirements for registration purposes
- Not an Australian Citizen
- Commit to obtaining an appropriate visa to work in Australia during the internship year (refer to the Department of Home Affairs website for details).

Priority Two category will be considered when the list of Priority One applicants is exhausted and there are vacant PHS internship positions available. Priority Two applicants must meet all of the following eligibility criteria to be considered:

- · Have met MBA provisional registration requirements as a medical practitioner
- Have met the MBA English language proficiency requirements for registration purposes
- commit to obtaining an appropriate visa to work in Australia during the internship year (refer to the <u>Department of Home Affairs</u> website for details).

Ineligibility

Applicants are NOT eligible for a placement under the PHS if they:

- Do not meet the Priority One or Priority Two eligibility criteria
- Have accepted an internship position from a state or territory government.

The Minister of Health, Minister Hunt has approved the extension of the current arrangements for an additional 12 months. Plans are in train for all current PHS particip private hospitals to be funded for the 2023 training year, in line with their current traplacement and funding agreements.

STATE PRIORITY PREFERENCING

Preferencing for international students

Depending on the state that you are applying to, there will be a different distribution of available spots across the state. For example, Victoria preserves a certain percentage of spots at each hospital for international students, with addition of rejected spots by local Category 1 students which tend to be regional / rural. In Queensland, most internships that remain after all domestic Australian students have been matched will be at the rural or regional hospitals. Positions can become available in major metropolitan hospitals due to rollback. However, the availability varies each year. NSW on the other hand uses a ballot-based system, with the regional rural networks traditionally being undersubscribed.

While a rural or regional focused approach could increase chances of obtaining an internship, we would also recommend preferencing the hospitals according to your own personal circumstances (i.e. how strong you are as a candidate compared to your cohort) and also your personal take on each hospital's culture and post-internship opportunities for your desired training pathways.
